CHALK PAINT WAX



Use Chalk Paint Wax to seal and protect furniture and walls painted with Chalk Paint.

Getting Started

We always recommend testing on a small area first. Apply a thin coat of Clear Chalk Paint Wax onto your painted surface, using a lint-free cloth or Chalk Paint Wax Brush. Apply the wax in big broad strokes in all directions then work small areas if necessary around mouldings or intricate details. Remove any excess by wiping gently with a clean cloth.

White Chalk Paint Wax can be applied directly onto painted surfaces. Apply



Dark or Black Chalk Paint Wax over wet Clear Wax. Remove any excess with Clear Wax and a clean cloth.

For a high-shine finish, allow 24 hours before buffing with a clean cloth.

Wax every part of your piece at least once. Two to three coats will create a water repellent, wipeable finish for dining room tables and kitchen cabinets.

Wax should be fully hardened after 5 days but solvents can take up to 21 days to fully evaporate. Results may vary depending on previous treatment of surface.



Aftercare

To maintain your finish, wipe with a damp cloth, re-wax when you can no longer buff to a nice sheen. Not recommended for areas with a lot of water. Wash brushes in hot water and soap immediately after use.

Tips & Tricks

- If creating a distressed look, apply wax before sanding, as it creates less dust and makes it easier to control the amount you take off.
- Chalk Paint Wax is not suitable for outdoor use. Alternatively use Chalk Paint Lacquer.
- For your own custom coloured wax, mix a small amount of Chalk Paint with Clear Chalk Paint Wax. Lightly brush over the area using a Chalk Paint Wax Brush for a soft blended look.
- Applying a second light coat of Clear Wax will help to ensure complete wax coverage and create a nice, even sheen, particularly when waxing over dark colours.

CLEAR

Clear Chalk Paint Wax emphasises depth of colour and gives a beautiful mellow finish, or can be buffed to a high sheen.

WHITE

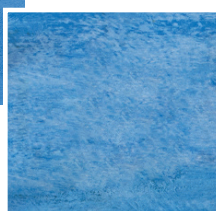
Use White Chalk Paint Wax to soften and lighten Chalk Paint colours. It can also be applied directly onto unvarnished wood to create a limed oak look.

DARK

Apply Dark Chalk Paint Wax to give age to your paintwork and emphasise brushmarks, cracks and texture.

BLACK

Black Chalk Paint Wax will give a cool, dark finish. Brings out texture in brushwork and mouldings, as well as darkening and enriching colours.
